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Meet Gavin Marks! Gavin is the Bridge to Work Employment Support Coordinator. Bridge to Work is a new initiative connecting Bridge Housing residents to employment opportunities.

Gavin is located at Bridge Housing's office. He has been working closely with many residents who are looking for work or wanting to improve their current work situation. Bridge to Work is a partnership between Bridge Housing and CoAct, an experienced Job Network Provider. Bridge to Work launched in June 2018 and already a number of residents have reached their employment goals. Check out some of their stories in this newsletter!

To be eligible for Bridge to Work, you must be a Bridge Housing tenant or household member, between 17 and 70 years old and on a low income such as Centrelink.

If you find employment for the first time or after being unemployed for 12 months,

you may be eligible for the Start Work Incentive which will provide a "rent freeze" period of 26 weeks.

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## **TAG Elections - Call for Nominations!**

### Our key focus areas are:

- 3. Building opportunities for younger tenants

#### **ADVANCE SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Advance Scholarship program is open to Bridge Housing residents who are at school, studying tertiary education or seeking professional development. An Advance Scholarship can provide financial support to help you achieve your goals. The amount of money you can apply for is dependent on your age. Primary school children are eligible for scholarships up to \$750, high school students are eligible for up to \$1000 and adults who are studying or pursuing professional development are eligible for up to \$1500.

#### **BIG IDEAS GRANTS**

The Big Ideas Grants initiative provides small grants to tenants for projects that bring people together in their neighbourhood or community. Tenants can apply for up to \$500 for an individual project or \$1000 if working in partnership with a community organisation.

# **Money Matters**

Keeping up with all your bills on a low income can be a struggle at times. Perhaps you have had some extra expenses, like fines and debt repayments, and may be interested in financial counselling. Financial counsellors are non-judgemental and help you to make a plan to improve your financial situation. Bridge Housing and Good Shepherd have teamed up to offer a free, confidential and independent financial counselling service – Money Matters. The financial advisor visits Bridge Housing on the 3rd Thursday of every month and can also meet you for appointments outside this time.

# **Appliance Replacement Offer**



If you're looking to upgrade your old fridge or television, you may be able to get a discount through the appliance replacement offer. Replacing older appliances with new and more efficient models can save you money on your electricity bills.

If you're eligible, you could save:

- ▲ 40% off the cost of a new fridge
- ▶ 50% off the cost of a new television.

The fridge and television models on offer have been selected for their energy efficiency, affordability and quality.

# **Legal Pathways for Older People**

Council on the Ageing NSW (COTA) and Legal Aid are offering assistance to help older people obtain free or reduced cost legal assistance.

Documents such as Wills, an Enduring Power of Attorney, or Appointment of Enduring Guardianship can be drawn up by a qualified solicitor at the office of COTA NSW (Sydney CBD) at a discounted rate of \$50 per document. This assistance is available to Aged Pensioners or holders of a Commonwealth Seniors Health Card.

## **Northern Beaches Update**

Our Meet and Greet sessions with Northern Beaches tenants kicked off on 9 August at the Warringah Library in Manly Vale. We have since visited Narraweena and Manly, joining over 150 tenants and family members for a welcome and information sharing lunch.

Several Bridge Housing tenants attended these sessions with us to answer any questions Northern Beaches tenants had about being a Bridge Housing resident. Women's Housing Company and FACS staff also attended.

Amongst other things, tenants asked questions about repairs and maintenance.

Repairs and maintenance for Northern Beaches tenants are provided by the NSW Government (LAHC) contractors for the first two years after the transfer. This means tenants continue to ring the same number for maintenance requests.

We have also been recruiting new staff for the Transition Team and for the Northern Beaches Housing Team, which will manage the Northern Beaches tenancies from August 2019.

## **New and Revised Policies**

Start Work Incentive Scheme – Bridge Housing is excited to announce the expansion of our Start Work Incentive (SWI) scheme from 4 weeks to 26 weeks. This means, if you are entering the workforce for the first time or starting a new job after being unemployed for over 12 months, Bridge Housing will apply

a rent freeze period for 26 weeks. This means your rent will not go up based on your new income for 26 weeks. As normal, you need to advise us within 21 days of starting the new job, so make sure you tell your housing manager or contact us on **02 8324 0800** for more details.
