Bridge Housing says Yes to The Voice to Parliament.

Bridge Housing acknowledges that the land we live and work on always was and always will be Aboriginal land. We support The Uluru Statement from the Heart as an invitation to the Australian people from First Nations people to walk together on a journey of reconciliation and the pathway forward laid out in the Statement.

Every day we bear witness to the ongoing impacts of colonisation experienced by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people experience much higher rates of homelessness and housing insecurity. This is due to discrimination and intergenerational disadvantage and compounded by a lack of culturally led and designed services.

Inclusion is a core value at Bridge Housing. We believe that people impacted by policy and decision making should have a real say in the way that these policies are developed. We believe the Voice to Parliament provides a genuine opportunity for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to provide meaningful feedback and advice on legislation and policy that impacts them. This will lead to better outcomes.



Voice, Treaty and Truth comprise the pillars of the Uluru Statement of the Heart. The Voice to Parliament, enshrined in our Constitution is the first step on a journey towards healing and reconciliation.

We understand that there are different perspectives on the best pathway to reconciliation and acknowledge divergent opinions. We will walk alongside and support our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander colleagues, tenants and service partners as we build our knowledge and garner support for the Voice.

Bridge Housing commits to Reconciliation and The Voice. We work alongside Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities to create welcoming and appropriate homes, places, and spaces. The Voice guarantees that first nation perspectives are actively heard in meaningful conversations and critical decisions.

CEO Update

Providing safe, secure and affordable homes is central to our mission at Bridge Housing. Caring for our planet is important, too. Our new property in Victoria St, Glebe, is providing us with a wonderful opportunity to do both things at the same time.



With a \$7.8M grant from the City of Sydney Council, Bridge has been able to purchase a block of 20 units in Glebe. The property provides affordable housing for Aboriginal women in a culturally safe environment.

The grant has also allowed us to upgrade the property to improve environmental

sustainability. We have done this by adding solar panels for the common area lighting, heat pumps to reduce energy costs and double glazed windows and insulation to improve energy efficiency. We are testing the environmental performance of the building before and after the upgrades. We will use this information to inform how we can improve the sustainability of other older buildings that we own as well. This will help Bridge Housing and tenants save money and reduce our impact on the planet.

Over the coming months, we will share more about actions we are taking to improve our environmental sustainability. We are also listening to tenants, who we know are resourceful and have plenty of good ideas about

keeping energy costs down.

We are also interested in hearing from tenants about how we can continue to improve our customer service and better respond to tenants' needs. Anytime you phone Bridge, you will be invited to give us feedback through a quick telephone survey. By giving us your thoughts, we

can learn how to do better. In July 9% of tenants stayed on the phone to respond to the survey. 83% of tenants were satisfied with our customer service.

You can also provide us with feedback by calling us, emailing us or using the My Bridge tenant app.

I would also personally like to thank tenants that have come along to our Time To Talk sessions in Redfern, Granville, Brookvale, Glebe and at our head office in Goulburn Street over the last few months. It has been wonderful to share what we are working on at Bridge Housing and to meet with you all.

An AGM is a meeting that Bridge Housing is required to hold every year. It is an opportunity to look back on the past year to celebrate successes and discuss what we have learned with members.

Usually, a company would invite its shareholders. As Bridge Housing is a not-for-profit organisation, our tenants are invited to attend as members.

All Bridge tenants are encouraged to become members officially. We look

forward to many of you joining us as returning or new members.

You do not have to be a member to attend the AGM, but being a member gives you more of a say. Members will be able to:

- ask the Directors questions about Bridge Housing's operations or finance,
- vote on any proposed resolutions, and
- elect or re-elect board members.

Even if you can't make it in person on the day, you can vote by completing a 'proxy nomination' which means someone can vote on your behalf if they attend the meeting.

At our AGM, the Directors will present on the company's performance over the last 12 months and outline our strategy for the future.

Attendees will be able to join the Bridge Housing staff and board of directors for lunch afterwards. We will send out more details and a reminder a few weeks before the event.

Linda received a Big Ideas Grant to organise a community event

What was your goal?

My goal was to have a social gathering with live music and pizza to get everyone together in the community room. I called the event 'Pizza Jam Session'.

Many tenants are new in our block of 16 units. Some tenants have existing relationships, and others are just getting to know each other.



What was your experience with the Big Ideas Grant Initiative?

I heard about the Big Ideas Grant from a neighbour who attended the North Tenant Advisory Group (TAG) meeting. I contacted the Communities team and arranged a time to meet to complete the application together.

Through the "Feed the Knead" program at our local Domino's, we were provided with free pizzas for the event. I was able to easily source the band as the lead singer of 'Hey Sugar Music' is a friend.

Communication between myself and the Communities team was a positive experience especially when we collaborated on the invitation and organisation of the day.

I formed a committee with two other neighbours who helped with preparation for the day. I did some door knocking to discuss the ideas with neighbours and invited the whole block.

The event was a great success with two thirds of the block attending and everyone asking when we could do it again. We all enjoyed singing along to songs we knew, dancing and chatting to each other outside.

The Big Idea Grant gave me the opportunity to use my event management skills and I felt a great sense of accomplishment by making the 'Pizza Jam Session' event happen.

We all appreciated Bridge Housing for funding the event and the donation from Domino's.



What has changed as a result of the Pizza Jam Session?

New connections have been formed and existing ones have been strengthened. Everyone is looking forward to the next event.

What's next?

There was some funding left over, which will go towards afternoon tea with party pies and sausage rolls, and a morning tea with cakes or doughnuts.

I want to schedule a social activity with the neighbours once per quarter to keep everyone connected.

Assets update

Bridge Housing has carried out property upgrades using \$3 million funding from NSW Land and Housing Corporation.

We agreed with our multi-trade contractor, Assett Group Services they would need extra resources to manage all this work, so they hired 13 contractors and 41 employees, including 7 apprentices and 2 indigenous workers.

We completed works on 134 properties including:

- ▶ Installing **59** new kitchens
- ▶ Applying **75** internal paints
- ▶ Upgrading **14** bathrooms
- ▶ Applying **7** external paints
- ▶ Installing **50** new floor surfaces
- ▶ Constructing **2** new fences
- ▶ Upgrading **7** roofs

And our tenants told us what the impact of these works was?

"I feel like I am living in a 'brand new home'." This uplifting feedback came from one of our Northern Beaches tenants, who felt that the tradespeople were very respectful, prompt, and efficient.

"I also want to acknowledge the electrician who installed the new hot water service system.

My heart is so, so happy. I am very, very thankful to Bridge Housing."

New Housing Properties in Granville, Western Sydney.

Bridge Housing recently allocated 35 new social and affordable homes in South Granville!

We welcomed the Honourable Member for Parramatta, Dr Andrew Charlton to the property for an afternoon tea with tenants to launch the new properties. The tenants shared their stories with us and were so happy with their new homes.

Our CEO, Rebecca Pinkstone said, "the NSW Land and Housing Corporation and Bridge Housing have worked together to bring this much-needed social and affordable housing development to life. Our team has worked tirelessly to ensure that these apartments meet the highest standards of modern quality design and provide safe, secure and affordable homes for residents."



New Womens' Refuge on the Northern Beaches

We also want to congratulate our partner, Women's Community Shelters on the launch of their new Women's shelter for the Northern Beaches area. This much-needed safe accommodation for at-risk women and children was launched by the Hon. Jodie Harrison MP, Minister for the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault.

Bridge Housing will partner with WCS and Northern Beaches Women's Shelters and deliver four self-contained units that will provide medium-term accommodation that will give the essential breathing space for women to regroup, get the

support they need to move forward in their lives and escape the trauma of domestic and family violence.

Our CEO Rebecca said, "Bridge Housing is honoured to work again with Women's Community Shelters to support women and children experiencing domestic and family violence. Our role in this shelter project includes upgrades to make each home fit for purpose, ongoing property management and then ultimately assisting families transition into permanent long-term housing. Together we are working closely

to end homelessness and ensure women and children fleeing violence have a safe, secure, and affordable home as a foundation for a better life." noted Rebecca Pinkstone.

The Northern Beaches project is in the design and development application stage and is anticipated to be completed by the end of 2023.

We pay our respect to the Elders we've lost and to those who continue fighting for us across all our Nations, we pay homage to them.


